Subject: **CMIEF APPLICATIONS – UNIVERSITY MARKS**

University transcripts accompanying application forms have marks for courses presented in either of two forms:

- A** - Grades expressed as a percentage, with an average for the term calculated in some cases (A₁), and not in others (A₂).
- B** - Letter grades from A+ down to F corresponding with grade points from 4.3 down to 0.0. The average for a term is the grade-point average (GPA) and all universities using this approach calculate a GPA.
- C** - Letter grades from A+ down to F corresponding with grade points from 9.0 down to 0.0. The average for a term is the grade-point average (GPA) and all universities using this approach calculate a GPA.

In the past, an attempt has been made to determine equivalent percentages, but this is prone to calculation errors etc. For 2024, the summary for each application will show either the cumulative average percentage (A) or the cumulative GPA (B), and the transcript enclosed with the application will show all of the marks. Neither Alberta, UBC nor McMaster show a cumulative grade in their transcript records and we have shown the most recent session average for their applications.
